Our values and beliefs as parents...

Love - Without love, all the other values in our life lose their meaning. When we love, we reflect the character of God and His love toward us. We strive to love by putting others first and seeking the highest good for others. We attempt to love through action, which goes beyond just a feeling. We also seek to forgive others when we are hurt and ask for forgiveness when we mess up. We will share this value with our child by displaying selflessness and forgiveness to our child the best we can. We hope love will be clearly understood. We will also teach this value through talking and by reading stories that explain what real love looks like.

Honesty - Truthfulness is vital to have a strong character. We will seek to have integrity in our lives as an example to our child by telling the truth and avoiding deceptive words or actions that would set a bad example. We will take the time to teach our child about the importance of honesty and to correct our child when he or she tells a lie. We will also build a relationship in which our child feels safe to tell us when he or she does something wrong. Our child will know he or she is still accepted and loved even when a mistake is made.

Faith - Faith in God is vital to have a relationship with Him. We will seek to demonstrate our faith in God to our child by trusting Him in the good times and bad, and seeking to act in a way toward our child and others that is sincere and not hypocritical. We will share this value with our child by teaching him or her about God, and by helping our child understand that faith is not blind; it is trusting in something and someone you know to be true.

Humility - Humility allows us to have a proper understanding of who we are in relation to others and to God. On the other hand, pride can be a hurtful thing that blurs our perspective and ruins relationships. We will put others first and be careful that our words do not communicate a prideful view of ourselves. We will seek to respect other people of all backgrounds and walks of life, and remember the great value they have. We will also be honest about our failures and mistakes and seek forgiveness when we are wrong. We will teach our child to avoid always being self-focused and to remember to share with other children and to be a real friend who serves others rather than demanding something from them. We will teach him or her about having a healthy understanding of who we are in relation to God, and that our value comes from our identity in Him - not from what we do or achieve. We will certainly cheer our child on when he or she achieves success, but we want to be careful that those achievements are not the foundation for his or her value as a person.

Hard work - A strong work ethic allows us to reach our fullest potential and achieve big things. We will strive to work hard at home and through our jobs. We will work to do things the right way and follow through when we start something. We will also try our best to live in a balanced way by taking time to spend with family and friends and not making work an all-consuming thing. We will teach this value to our child in the simple things like picking up toys and cleaning his or her room. We will encourage our child to finish a task or job he or she undertakes and not to give up. We will help our child understand the positive results of hard work that pay off in the end.
