Kindness - As teachers, we see the effects of kids being kind or not kind to each other, but this is something that can be seen in adults too. When people aren't kind, it can be devastating to a person's psychological well-being. We are kind to our friends, our family, our coworkers, students, and strangers. We use kind words and are respectful of others and their beliefs. We put ourselves in their shoes and always try to see what people need to feel respected around us. We will raise our child to be kind to others and for them to see us being kind to others as well. This is something we will talk about on a regular basis.

Hospitality - We feel the best way to get to know people and for them to get to know us is in our home with the comforts a home can bring- good food, a nice ambiance, music and conversation. We have friends and family over regularly, and occasionally host the neighborhood get-together, a school staff social, or a church party. We will have our child's friends over to play and also spend time with their friends' parents.
