# Our Values & Beliefs as Parents

KINDNESS AND COMPASSION - Paula is a nurse, so a kind disposition comes naturally to her. We believe it is important to be kind to everyone because you can never know what kind of day someone is having and how you can influence it by your attitude in even a small interaction. We will teach our child to be kind by listening to others' opinions, not letting anger take over, and by giving grace to others. For young children, a difficult lesson is learning how to play nicely and share with others, patiently waiting your turn. Positive reinforcement will help them learn how to be kind and compassionate.

INTEGRITY - Integrity is important because very often the easy choice and the right choice don't coincide. We both have the strength of character and the integrity to make the right choice even if it's a difficult one. Aaron often uses integrity to make tough decisions in his job. We will teach our child integrity by discussing with the child why taking the easy road may not be the best option. One of the most important aspects of having integrity is admitting when you are wrong and could have improved. We will praise them for the things they did well and discuss alternatives when they could have made a better decision.

HONESTY - We have to be able to admit when we're wrong and learn from our mistakes. In our marriage, it's important to be honest with each other about our feelings and our wants and needs in order for our relationship to grow and stay healthy. We will teach our child to be honest in all they do by demonstrating how relationships and personal/professional goals can flourish when we're honest. As children grow, they naturally test the boundaries of what is and isn't acceptable and honesty is one of the earliest things tested. We will reinforce the importance of honesty by praising them when they tell the truth. Many movies and tv shows are excellent opportunities for discussion, pausing movies and discussing what effect each character's actions can have on those around them will help our child understand what it means to be honest.

TOLERANCE - We encounter people each day who have lived experiences that are different from our own. We understand and value that it is those experiences that make us who we are. We plan to teach our child about tolerance by discussing with them how everyone has different beliefs, opinions, and experiences. We will talk through difficult situations with them, modeling through role play, what it looks like to collaborate with those who have different experiences. We will also expose our child to different ideas and beliefs through family trips and vacations to different areas. We think it's important for our child to be exposed to a second language as language is an important part of learning about different cultures, ideas, and beliefs.

FAMILY BONDS - Friends and coworkers may come and go, but family is always there to support us through good times and bad. We will teach our child about the importance of building family relationships by regularly spending time with members of our family. Our child will participate in family gatherings throughout the year to play games and have fun for hours on end. Paula's extended family has kids of all age ranges that will play and grow up with our child. Aaron is the handy man of the family and often helps both his family and Paula's. Our child will participate in these activities learning that family bonds are built through both fun and hard work.
