# Our Values & Beliefs as Parents

**EQUITY & INCLUSION -** We will teach our child to be inclusive of others and recognize that everyone is unique and our differences are something to be celebrated. We are open to new people and experiences every day and we want our child to be accepting and open to new ideas and cultures as well. We will foster open-mindedness and respect for others, regardless of ethnicity, ability, gender, culture or income, to ensure our child understands we are all equal.

**EMPATHY & COMPASSION** - Empathy is the ability to be aware of the feelings of others and imagine what it might be like to be in their position. This ability reduces conflict and misunderstanding and leads to kindness and greater success in life. The more children receive empathy and compassion, the more likely they are to offer it to others. By expressing compassion, we are better community members. We will teach empathy as a skill that develops over time by modeling it ourselves, talking openly about emotions and listening to our child.

INDEPENDENCE - A sense of independence helps a child develop confidence, self-esteem, motivation, and courage. It also fosters a sense of freedom. Life comes with challenges and a strong sense of self will help our child trust themselves. We will provide a rich learning environment to explore and encourage new experiences. We will promote problem-solving and praise our child's efforts. We will encourage our child to do things like put air in their bike tire and ride their bike to get ice cream, and order for themselves at restaurants to help establish independence.

LOVE OF THE NATURAL WORLD - We want our child to live in the world with a love and respect for nature. Clean air and water are basic human needs. To ensure a sustainable future with enough clean air and water, we need to support our local ecosystems. We do this at home by reducing, reusing, and recycling. In our garden we plant species that are native to the area to protect the ecosystem. We will teach our child about local farming, different plants and animals that we rely upon, how energy works, and what happens to our waste. We will support the natural world by teaching sustainable habits to our child, such as using reusable bottles, buying seasonal foods and shopping for products made in the USA.

SENSE OF HUMOR - We create community with humor at home, with friends, and at work. We are part of two families that refuse to take life too seriously. ### Our Home

We live in a walkable community in a suburb of Chicago, steps away from a forest preserve on Lake Michigan. The neighborhood is great for kids!
