It's especially important to us that they know how blessed they are. One winter we took our little niece to a youth shelter to donate coats to other kids there. She kept commenting on how cold it was outside and it was awesome to see her register that many kids don't have coats to keep them warm. She instantly wanted to go to the store for more coats.

STRONG WORK ETHIC - When our child commits to a sport or task, we want to encourage them to give it everything they have. Our Home






Our Family
