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### Our Values & Beliefs as Parents

**EMPATHY** - We like to support charitable causes that focus on helping people with their struggles. We have supported many causes and organizations, including working in soup kitchens supplying food as well as serving and helping to clean up. With our children, we believe it is important for them to learn "to whom much is given, much is expected" and to always be kind to others. As our children get older, they too will volunteer to support others, including age-appropriate activities like mulching parks, playing Bingo at the senior center, and collecting donations for unhoused individuals.

**ACCEPTANCE** - We believe the best way to learn acceptance is to spend time in diverse situations and to see as much of the world as possible. We believe it is important to expose our children to different sports, churches, after school programs and the like. Our church believes Black Lives Matter, Women's Rights are Human Rights, and supports the LGBTQ community. This is what we want our children to learn, to accept everyone! We want our children to remember that people are people, regardless of their differences.

**HONESTY** - Honesty is something that will build someone's reputation over a long time, but dishonesty is something that can destroy it in an instant. We will teach this to our children by being as specific as possible when explaining things in an age-appropriate manner and rewarding the children with treats and trips to Chuck E. Cheese for telling the truth. We want our children to know that they can always be honest with us, that they do not need to hide anything from us, and that we will always be there even when they make mistakes.

**EDUCATION** - We believe in continually learning, and that school education is incredibly important and takes a certain discipline that will help a child throughout the rest of their adult life. However, we also believe that education is a lifelong process and cannot be quantified simply by test scores at a school. Our goal is to actively educate our children and to strike a good balance between school skills and life skills. We try to achieve this with travel, volunteer work, sports, social activities, and a life-long love for reading.

**RESPECT** - We feel that respect is a prerequisite for taking a view on life that is empathetic and accepting. To demonstrate respect, we think it's important to listen without interruption, and to keep an even tone without raising our voices. We teach this in our family by making sure we give everyone the time to speak and to not let our voices get loud. We use our words and talk about how we are feeling to help regulate our emotions when we are sad, mad, disappointed, or frustrated. This may include blowing out candles, box breathing, or even hitting a pillow.

LOVE - We believe that a family is the one place in this world where a person must be loved and accepted for who they are without fear of rejection, judgment, or negative consequences. We are here for each other no matter what. Love and family is above and beyond any other relationships in the world. There is nothing our children can do to cause us to reject them or not have them in our lives. Nothing.

### Our Home

We love our home and neighborhood! It's a great community with many gathering places for families.
