COMPASSION – It's important to understand and empathize with other people's struggles. We can all use a little more kindness. We talk through our feelings and listen to each other. We volunteer to help at our son's school. We regularly give to friends in need and donate to local charities. We will teach our children about compassion through conversation and our actions. We start conversations about compassion when we are watching kid shows, reading bedtime stories, and playing video games. We will share volunteer work with our children at an appropriate age.

LEARNING - The world is a fascinating place with many beautiful things to learn. We are both lifelong learners. We have college degrees and enjoy learning for fun. Isaac studies German for fun, keeps up with the news, and follows three or four podcasts. Jennifer is intrigued by stories, science, and math. She likes to solve math problems and read about physics.
